Saturday & Sunday: 8:00am to 10:30am


◆ Visitors must be pre-approved by Administration and are generally limited to parents & guardians, case-related personnel and clergy.

# What We Do

The Cascade County Regional Youth Services Center is a 24-bed, long-term facility that provides a safe, secure environment for criminally charged youth, ages 10-18 years old. Detention services are provided to the North Central Region (Cascade, Toole, Blaine, Hill, Pondera, Choteau, Broadwater, Glacier, Lewis & Clark, Teton, Phillips, and Liberty Counties). The Center also provides detention services to Counties outside the region, as well as the Department of Corrections, Bureau of Indian Affairs, and the US Marshalls.

## Mission Statement

*To provide for the care, welfare, safety and security of detention youth. We accomplish our mission by constantly striving for the highest level of quality care possible.*

While in detention the youth receive a variety of services including: year round full day school with two full time certified teachers, therapeutic and recreational services to include Yoga, AA, Bible Study, Church, Game Night, Team Building and Adventure Groups, Nutrition Education, Art and Pet Therapy, Responsible Choices, and Mentoring. Other services provided include transportation to and from placements, court and upon arrest and discharge. Electronic monitoring is also provided for youth ordered by the Court to house arrest. The Center's main goal is to enhance the ability of youth to achieve success and become productive members of society.


## INNOVATIVE BEHAVIOR MANAGEMENT

Youth rehabilitation is the cornerstone of the new behavior management system launched 2018 January. It is built with key components from established systems used in classrooms, correctional institutions and treatment facilities, customized to meet the unique and evolving needs of youth in our center. Our focus is to shape positive behaviors and address negative behaviors, and is guided by the following principals:

- ◆ A center-wide set of beliefs about what behaviors and relationships are valued and important.
- ◆ Total, collaborative staff commitment to managing youth behavior using a multidisciplinary approach.
- ◆ Clearly defined and widely communicated expectations for behavior.
- ◆ Programmatic effort to help youth develop skills in self-control, problem solving, conflict resolution and positive social relationships.
- ◆ A set of well-defined, equitably enacted consequences with clear, fair procedures to address negative and anti-social behavior.
- ◆ A dynamic system that engages youth in meaningful, authentic motivation, accountability and learning.

## EDUCATION: CREDIT RECOVERY, HiSET® PREPARATION & TESTING

Education is critical to long-term success and is thus a major component of CCJDC programming. Two full-time, State of Montana certified teachers provide year-round educational programming to all center youth and focus either on credit recovery or HiSET® preparation depending on individual youth needs. CCJDC is an official HiSET® Test Center available to juveniles both in detention and the community who have been withdrawn from high school roles. HiSET® testing is available upon request.
